VI. New Business:

1. Coronavirus Update:

The Superintendent informed the School Committee that educators in AOS 96 have been attending vaccination appointments. He also informed the School Committee that building occupancy rates have risen to 50%, due to a change in State requirements. The building occupancy rate will change to 75% at the end of May. The Superintendent also explained that 6 feet of social distancing is still in effect, therefore the actual number of people that can occupy a building may be less than 50% and less than 75% in May. Building principals will be developing occupancy plans for sporting events and graduations.

2. ESSER 2 Projects:

The Superintendent and Building Principals reviewed the proposed ESSER 2 projects with the School Committee including a new phone system, new computers and upgrades to the physical plant.

3. American Rescue Stimulus Plan:

The Biden Administration's American Rescue Stimulus Plan will provide the Machias schools with an allocation of \$1,774,107.00. Similar to the other Federal grants during the pandemic, the requirements for expenditures must be related to Coronavirus prevention.

4. Sports Update:

The Superintendent reported that the basketball season was successful for AOS 96 schools. Currently, AOS 96 schools are participating in volleyball and pee wee basketball.

5. Graduation:

The Superintendent reported that the Principals are working on a graduation seating plan for attendees.

6. New Immunization Law:

The Superintendent explained that a new immunization law was passed last year that will be implemented in the 21/22 school year. This law requires all students to receive State required immunizations unless the student has a medical exemption or current IEP.

7. Rose M. Gaffney Roof:

The Superintendent informed the School Committee that the Rose M. Gaffney Elementary School roof needs extensive repairs. He will gather more information for the next School Committee meeting.

8. Draft 21/22 Calendar:

The Superintendent distributed copies of the draft 21/22 AOS 96 school calendar. After explaining the calendar, the School Committee took action.

*The Maine Department of Education has released the new vendor for Math and ELA. This assessment will be the NWEA and administered in grades 3-8. The good news is that we have administered the NWEA for several years.
