  - 1. MMHS Project Update:

The Superintendent updated the School Committee regarding the new classroom that is being developed at Machias Memorial High School. The carpentry work has begun and other infrastructure work will be completed in the next few weeks.

### 2. Transportation:

The Superintendent reported the transportation of Lubec students has remained the same since our last meeting. He also informed the

School Committee there is a CTE bus driver vacancy in the Machias School Department. This position will be advertised and interviews will be conducted.

# 3. Snowplowing:

The Superintendent informed the School Committee regarding the 2007 snowplow truck repairs. He also indicated the school department is still looking for a driver for the plow truck.

# 4. Snow Days:

The Principals and Superintendent spoke to the School Committee regarding having remote learning days during snow days. The Principals will be seeking input from staff and parents on this topic. The School Committee was in agreement for the school department to conduct remote learning days during snow days if the input to do so is positive.

# 5. MSMA Fall Conference Report:

The Superintendent reported that he attended the MSMA Fall Conference in Augusta on October 26-28, 2022. The Keynote Speaker was David Horsager, CEO of The Trust Edge Leadership Institute. He has written several books on building trust in organizations and has developed the 8 pillars of trust. The Superintendent also attended sessions on collective bargaining and Special Education Law.

#### 6. MSSA Funding Committee:

The Superintendent reported that he is a member of the MSSA Funding Committee. In a recent meeting, officials from the Maine Department of Education indicated the total state valuation has increased by 6%. If municipal valuations increase by more than 6% it could result in a loss of State subsidy.

### 7. MSSA Legislative Committee:

The Superintendent informed the School Committee that he is a member of the MSSA Legislative Committee. This session there is no limit on the number of bills legislators can sponsor. The MSSA Legislative Committee will be reviewing bills when the new session begins in January 2023.

#### 8. Teacher Nomination:

The Superintendent nominated Celia Jellison for the Alternative Education teaching position for the 2022/2023 school year.
